Therefore with more students this would now be dangerous. So it was be looked to see whether the road could be stopped between the Bridge and the Church. Signage was being tightened up generally. In particular dogs not being kept on leads was a concern with livestock and people would be challenged. There was a possibility of local volunteer wardens.</p> <p>Lambing Sunday 24th March 2019 They were looking to make this a community event. The Bishop of Lincoln was invited. They were looking to a nature trail, craft stalls and light refreshments. They were charging £1.00 per adult. Children no charge. Community support welcome.</p> <p>Cycle Track beside A15 Harvey Dowdy raised how dark the track was which made it dangerous. It was agreed the Parish Council would write in support of lights on that stretch.</p>
